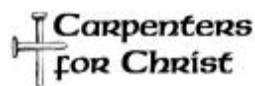

## A Circle of Love

Habitat reminds me of a “circle”.....it has no beginning and no ending. Within that circle is the activity generated by countless Habitat for Humanity volunteers building homes for low-income families.

Actually, there is a process that takes place prior to the physical construction of Habitat homes and it begins with a “3”-Day application opportunity for low-income families to apply.

The Selection Committee and Public Relations Committee worked closely in developing the application announcement flyer and other media tools to be distributed through many of the outreach programs, churches, organizations as well as the news media. These two committees have created some very impressive “eye-catching new material” to “blitz” the community in getting the application information out to more people. Take a look at it in this newsletter .....and pass it on to a family you think may be a possible applicant candidate; **the next “3”-Day application opportunity will take place in January.**

The selection process is a very difficult job and it takes special dedicated, compassionate but yet professional volunteers to select qualified families. They assist applicants with their applications, verify document information from the maze of required paperwork for each family, and disqualify families with incomplete paperwork, insufficient income or over-qualified income and other miscellaneous reasons. The Selection Committee does home visits on prospective families, which gives them first hand knowledge to the living conditions and do further cuts accordingly. These home visits are very revealing and at times heart breaking.....the need for decent, affordable housing for some of these low-income families is enormous. Prayer is most essential to this committee as they seek the Lord’s will in their selection.

The Selection Committee prepares and presents a profile of each family they recommend to the Habitat Board of Directors. The families are not identified by name. The Board then selects the new families from the profiles provided to them. The Selection Committee notifies the families that they have been officially selected and the families not chosen are notified and encouraged to try again the following year.

The next process is handled by The Family Support Committee (FSC.) They are the main contact between the affiliate and the newly selected families for a Habitat home. The new families are welcomed to Habitat and given an overview of what will take place according to when their home is scheduled to be built and what is expected of them. Prior to this meeting, the FSC recruits a couple or a person to be the Family Support Advocate (FSA) for each family. The FSA is invaluable not only to their assigned family but to the FSC and the affiliate as well; the FSA are encouraged to try to bond with their

families by working on site with them if possible, to call just to see how things are and if they have any questions and to attend the four “mandatory” Homeowner Education Workshops (HEW) with their assigned families.

The FSC sets up and conducts the four mandatory HEW meetings spaced over a period of a few weeks for these families and their FSA.

- Orientation/Data Collection/Sweat Equity Contract
- An actual hands on work day building a home where they can meet some of the volunteers and to work on a Habitat home and end with a Budget Workshop after lunch
- Social Services Workshop
- Another hands-on work day plus a Home Maintenance & Stewardship of home presentation by one of our crew chiefs.

The presentations are all pretty intensive and the focus is on the required 300 Sweat Equity hours each family must work on their home or another Habitat home. These hours must be completed before the family can move into their home. Working on Habitat construction helps them to understand the construction of their home and the importance of taking care of their home inside and out becomes more of a reality.

The Family Support Committee members are regular construction volunteers which gives them an opportunity to know and work with the families. So much is involved in working with these families and you never know what situations may arise and you deal with them as they happen.

Most of these families are dealing out of their comfort zone in things that we take for granted, so it is important to be alert and insightful to areas that need attention, understanding, but at the same time as volunteers are there to support these families and hopefully help them to be self-sufficient and grow in confidence. We do not want them to become dependent on Habitat.

The Support Advocates encourage their family when needed; help with house dedication plans and with transfer or setup of utilities if needed. We encourage their attendance at the final closing and to continue communication with the family after dedication.
