Why We Build

There are stories of three home dedications in this issue, so it seems like a great opportunity to tell you a little bit about Habitat and why these houses were built.

Habitat for Humanity of Hood County is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian housing ministry supported by people who believe in its work.

Through volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat builds simple, decent houses alongside our partner families.

At Habitat we are driven by the desire to give tangible expression to the love of God through the work of eliminating poverty housing. Our mission and methods are derived from 3 key theological concepts:

1. Putting Faith into Action

We follow the teachings of Jesus Christ to love and care for one another. Habitat provides an opportunity for people to put their faith and love into action.

2. The Economics of Jesus

When we act in response to human need, giving what we have without seeking profit or interest, we believe God magnifies the effects of our efforts.

3. The Theology of the Hammer

Everyone can use the hammer as an instrument to manifest God's love.

To date over 350,000 houses have been built in 93 countries. With Habitat affiliates in all 50 states of the United States, Habitat for Humanity has been ranked in the top 15th largest homebuilder by Builder Magazine over the last 3 years. And in 2009, despite the struggling economy, more than 61,000 families were served by Habitat worldwide—a record number served in a single year!

Now in Hood County, we have built 52 Habitat homes!

Habitat is not a giveaway program. In addition to a down payment and monthly mortgage payments, these homeowners are required to invest 300 hours of their own labor – what we call “sweat equity” – into building their Habitat house and the houses of others.

Habitat houses are sold and financed to partner families at no profit – this means it's a no-interest loan. And the homeowners' monthly mortgage payments over the 20 year loan cycle are used to build more Habitat houses.

In Hood County we are pleased to report we have never had a homeowner default on their loan.

Our Habitat affiliate practices good stewardship with all funds entrusted to its mission. Every year our affiliate receives a clean opinion on our audited financial statements. And we do this with no paid staff and an all-volunteer Board.

The work of Habitat for Humanity is always about community. Once Habitat homeowners are settled into their houses, they tend to spread good will throughout the community. A recent study by the University of Southern Indiana found that people who live next door to Habitat homeowners say they are good neighbors—often the best in the neighborhood. And we know good neighbors build community.

Countless Habitat volunteers are working around the clock somewhere in the world. And the result? A Habitat house dedicated every 10 minutes.

Habitat Texas Presents Awards

Carey Gentry accepted the “**Business of the Year**” award for **Community Bank**. They were cited for providing matching funds every year, servicing our homeowner mortgages, and facilitating the FHLB Partnership Grant. Community Bank also sponsors a house each year, and its employees volunteer many hours on the construction site.



Carol Davidson, our volunteer executive director, received the Mary Ruth Rodenbaugh **Leadership Award**. The presenter cited her being a founder in 1996, and overseeing growth to 5 houses per year to where we now have 52 homes serving 197 men, women and children.

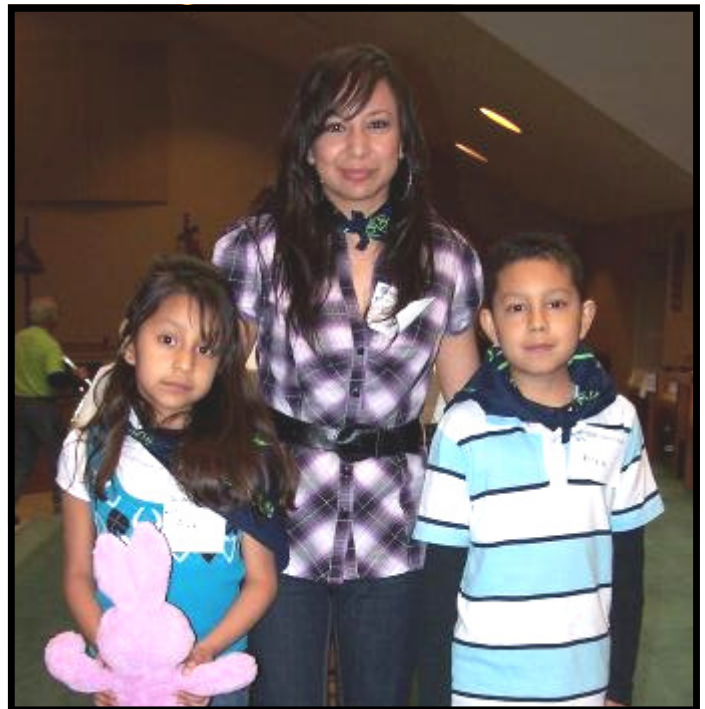

Habitat and Community Bank are proud to present "living proof" that anyone can make their dream come true; be it obtaining an education, learning English or some language, finding a job, buying a home, a car....you name it.....it can be done. It has been done by our 27-year-old single mom with two children, Patricia Mosqueda.

-Think it out-make a plan-follow through-
-It is all up to you-
-It will change your life-

Patricia came to the United States at the age of 13 and being in a strange country, not knowing English and no friends, she was absolutely miserable and cried for a month, literally every day. She went through months of not knowing what was going on in school, but she listened, observed, watched cartoons in English and hard as it was, the English capability became a reality after a year and a half; and she worked at it, just as she worked helping her mother clean houses.

One of Patricia's gifts is her awareness of life and her work ethics. Her father, Rosario, was a prime example of those ethics, working every Habitat workday on his daughter's house!

With two children, there were, of course, hardships and her parents allowed her to live with them while she got on her feet; the kids sharing a bed with their mom. Through the years in working with her mother, she realized she could literally have her own business and had already built a clientele who knew her as a dependable hard worker. Her very own "house cleaning business" was born about five years ago. She bought and paid off her truck and has not allowed herself to get into debt.

One day, one of her clients told her about Habitat and encouraged her to apply. As with so many people, she never dreamed she would qualify, but qualify she did and the rest is memorable history. This was a wonderful Tricelebration; the 50th Habitat home milestone for our local affiliate, the annually sponsored home by Community Bank and finally a grand home dedication for Patricia and her children, Alex and Abby.

The dedication for the 50th Habitat home was held at St. Francis Cabrini Catholic Church due to the added importance and the need for more room to accommodate a larger attendance. It was quite a celebration with all the Habitat Covenant Churches invited to participate, family, friends and Habitat volunteers eager to share this special day with Patricia and her family, whom they had grown to admire and respect.

Patricia and her mom, Ofelia, sister Maria and Aunt Anita made "500 HOMEMADE PORK AND CHICKEN TAMALES" and ATOLE (hot Mexican chocolate drink) for the dedication reception as their way to thank Community Bank and the Habitat volunteers for all their time, work and friendship given so freely to her and the other Habitat families in working with them to build their homes. 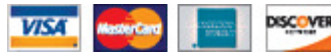
