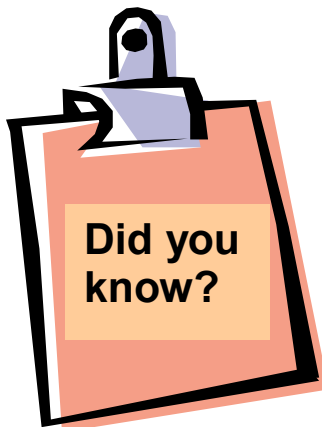

Habitat for Humanity of Hood County Goes Greener

In July 2007, a few members of our Board of Directors attended the Habitat Texas' Summer Leadership Conference in Georgetown, Texas. One of the many sessions involved Habitat's initiative to "go green." Specifically, the sessions identified actions that Habitat affiliates could take to be more environmentally friendly while still accomplishing the mission of providing simple, decent housing for qualified and deserving families.



After returning to Hood County, our Executive Committee decided that being more environmentally friendly was definitely a worthwhile goal. Having attended the Georgetown conference and all the "go green" sessions, Paul Beckman was eager to get started and gladly accepted the appointment as "Chairman" of our own Green Team. At that time, our processes were to burn brush, tree limbs, and wood scraps, and to place everything else in dumpsters to be hauled away.

While Paul was researching initiatives we could accomplish, one of our existing processes came into question. The Hood County Fire Marshal passed by our work site where we were burning wood from an abandoned mobile home. We were politely informed that we should not burn in the neighborhood. So, heeding good advice, we no longer burn anything on Habitat worksites.

To overcome the "burn ban" and still accomplish the green initiative, we began using a wood chipper to chop up wood scraps and tree limbs, which worked very well and produced mulch as a by-product. We also tried feeding sheetrock scraps into the chipper. While this did an outstanding job of reducing the sheetrock to a powder form, the chipper also produced a dust cloud similar to that of the recent Iceland volcano. Our past president of

the board happened to walk by as the Green Team was "mulching" the sheetrock, gave us a "puzzled" look, and continued on his more important duties. Although we were not interfering with air traffic into DFW Airport, we decided not to mulch sheetrock again.

We have learned from our experiences and are getting better at going greener. Today, we recycle paper, cardboard, and metals. We give burnable wood scraps and firewood to families who burn them for heat during the winter, and we also use leftovers from the framing material to make building blocks for Habitat homeowners' children. While we have made substantial progress at recycling, Paul continues to explore other areas for recycling, such as roof shingles.

In August 2010, while at the Habitat Texas conference, among many other things, Alan Sloan learned of new ways to insulate outside corners of our houses and between window and door headers. He also adopted the use of sill tape and caulk to insulate between the bottom plates of the walls and the concrete floor. Not only is this better for stopping air leaks to and from our houses, but it eliminates our use of "pooky," a messy plastic cement. Alan continues to explore other possibilities to better insulate Habitat houses. Saving energy helps both the environment and Habitat homeowners.



We at Habitat for Humanity of Hood County are trying to be better stewards of our natural resources. The environment and our homeowners are the winners in this Habitat initiative. GO GREEN!

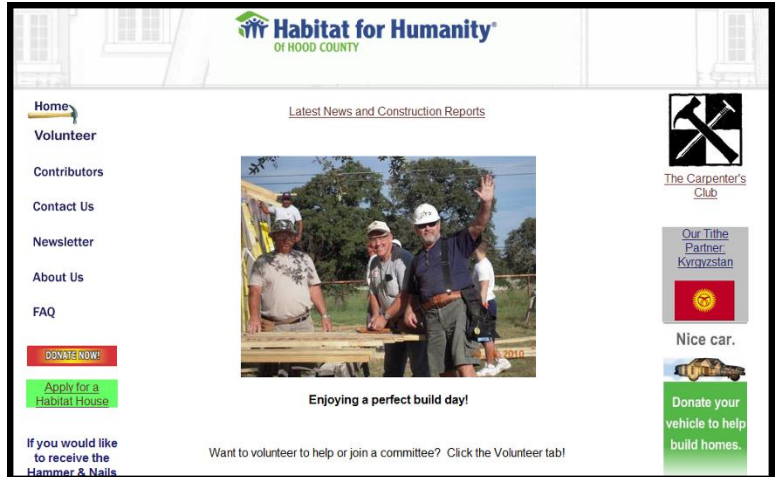
Attention Direct Depositors!
