Not Bad for an “OFF” Day

The other day, I drove out to the Habitat neighborhood to take some measurements. Keep in mind that this was on a Tuesday, not a scheduled work day. When I got to our homes, I found a paint team spraying the interior of a home, a cement crew pouring driveways, a wiring crew installing electrics, a plumbing crew topping-off a home, and another worker just checking to see what was going on and if he could help. That was a total of 19 workers in the neighborhood. Not bad for an off day. God has blessed this ministry with wonderful people. Our total volunteer attendance on scheduled work days has been between 60 and 80 people per week!

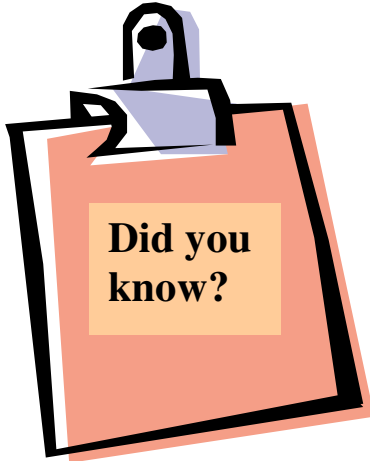

Youth Policy at the Construction Site

Due to policy at Habitat headquarters:

16 & 17 year-olds may participate at the worksite, *excluding power tools and roof work.*

14 & 15 year-olds can only do non-construction type work, on days of no active construction. (We interpret active construction as framing, roofing, siding, ect,- work that requires power tools to be used.) Non-construction work includes things like painting, caulking and yard work.

Under 14 years of age are not permitted on the site while construction is in progress.

Workers and families all must abide by this policy.

A Special Blessing

3614 Sundown Trail will belong to **Jimmy and Pauline Layland** and their **five kids** when we finish building it. Most of you know, we are attempting to build five houses this year which is one more than we usually build.

God is honoring our increased commitment by providing special additional donors for this house. Jimmy works for *Morrison Plumbing Supply* which is donating all of the plumbing and HVAC supplies.

United Coop Services has stepped up to provide increased attic insulation, storm doors, cfl light bulbs, and pay the difference to upgrade the HVAC unit from a 15 to a 17 Seer rating (greatly increased efficiency).

Crown Roofing provided free labor installing the roof felt, valley material, metal edging, ridge vents, and shingles. *G&G Electric* donated labor and materials for wiring the entire house (they have done this for us before too). The *Walmart* Store managed by Anthony Drake in Ft. Worth is going to donate \$1000 worth of landscaping items, and have a team of their employees install them. *Skye Tankless Water Heaters* is donating a whole-house unit to the home.

We can't thank all of these businesses enough for not only keeping Habitat going, but also enabling us to expand our ministry. Look for more details on sponsors for this home and the others at the home dedication celebration in November.
