Building the 50th Habitat House

When volunteers broke ground for the first Habitat house in Hood County in November 1996, the idea of building 50 houses did not even enter their minds. Yet--13 years later—that milestone is about to be reached. In January 2010, construction will begin on the 50th Habitat House in Hood County! This achievement is made possible by the dedication of our volunteers, the prayers of our community, and the support of individuals, businesses, churches and other non-profit organizations, and most of all, by the grace of God. When we began this housing ministry, we had little other than faith and enthusiasm. After 13 years, as the completion of Houses 48 and 49 nears, we still have an all-volunteer organization which has been regularly recognized by Habitat for Humanity International. We are quite proud of the fact that our last audit revealed we spent only 2% on administrative costs (most of which was for required insurance and the audit).

The 50th House has been designated a "Community Bank" house, in honor of the partnership we have had with Community Bank for each of the 13 years we have been in existence. Community Bank staff will help to construct the home, and will also pay the cost of materials that go into the house. And, again—as they have for each of those 13 years—Community Bank will match cash donations from other contributors from November 16, 2009 until January 30, 2010.

We invite each of you to visit the 50th House construction site in the Rancho Brazos development of Hood County. We would love to have you build with us, but if that isn't possible, we know you would be blessed by meeting the wonderful families who will live in these Habitat homes, and our other volunteers. If you can't come to the work site, we ask for your prayers for the continued success of our affiliate. And, if you can, please write a check to help us keep building. You can drop it by any branch of Community Bank, and they will match it!

Volunteerism

President Kennedy, in his inaugural address, issued a challenge to the American people by declaring, "Ask not what your country can do for you – ask what you can do for your country." Today, President Obama continues that challenge by asking Americans to make service a part of our daily lives.

Although I spent my working career as a civil servant for the Federal government, and Susan spent her career serving non-profit organizations and the Federal government, for Susan and me, volunteerism is not about politics. For us, it's a God-thing, best written by Paul long ago, "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." (Hebrews 13:16)

Volunteerism started early in life for me, when my Dad "volunteered" my brother and me to help others build houses, barns, and fences, harvest crops, or anything it seemed to us that had to do with "hard labor." But seeing the homeowner's smiling faces and tears of joy at the end of the day clearly impressed on me that we were doing a good thing – by simply helping others in need.

We were not a wealthy family. In fact, we probably were very close to the poverty line – if there was such a line in those days. But what I noticed, even at an early age, was that we were far better off than many in our community and that was why my Dad taught me to help others who needed more than us. In those days, it wasn't about gov-

ernment helping people. It was about people helping people. Today, it seems to me that many in our society have lost that focus.

For Susan and me, our lives have been blessed far beyond anything we imagined as young adults. It was Susan who introduced the Christian ministry into volunteerism for me. Habitat for Humanity is a perfect fit – good work, sharing with others, and helping people. No matter where we have built houses, our desire is always "to do good and to share with others."

Today, we volunteer as a couple simply because we want to give back to our community, our country, and our world. We do this because it's the right thing to do for us. The smiling faces and tears of joy are more than sufficient "compensation." Volunteerism is not about us, it's all about doing God's work.

Carol Davidson noted that this dedication was particularly special because the settlement took place just the day before.

Phyllis Anderson, Chair, Speakers Bureau, welcomed the guests and opened the ceremonies. Pastor Glenn Ward, Acton Baptist Church, then said the opening prayer. HFH Exec. Director, Carol Davidson introduced the board members. Jan Pope, HFH Board Member gave special recognition to the Board and all our faithful volunteers.

Long-time volunteer Wayne Hagood presented the keys to a happy Ruth Alvarado, after which Habitat's Family Advocates' Committee members - Elsie Tallant and Sally Beckman then presented the family with a Bible.

It was good to see our retired volunteer, Howard Hayre who did the Volunteer recognition; Jan & Larry Pope have been terrific Advocates for Trica & her girls and they presented the Bible; some wonderful gifts were presented to the family by the Mary-Martha Circle, Lakeside Baptist Loaves & Fishes, Master Gardeners, Ran-

cho Brazos Community Center; Welcome to the Neighborhood by Christy Langston (Habitat homeowner), and for the first time—The Granbury Quilting Guild presented a beautiful handmade quilt!

Paul Beckman (Site Selection Chair), “our man of many hats” has developed some on-going projects such as recycling. He and his volunteers are known as the “Green Team”. They pick up and haul off all trash, eliminating the expense of a dumpster, build privacy fences when needed, trim trees as needed.




