HFH of Hood County

HFH of Hood County was established in 1996. This HFH affiliate is managed by multi-denominational volunteers. There is no paid staff. The volunteers build on Wednesdays and Saturdays, September-May. HFHHC builds 2, 3, and 4 bedroom houses with 1 or 2 bathrooms. The houses are approximately 900-1300 square feet depending on the floor plan. Homes are completed with central air/heat, grass, fenced backyard, small storage building, stove and refrigerator. The finished homes are SOLD to low income families with a no-interest 20-year mortgage.

Families in Need

Families with completed applications are chosen based on need, willingness to partner in building their home, and the ability to make monthly payments of approximately \$350-\$450 and a \$700 down payment. Pray for HFHHC - Please join us as we pray for Hood County and for those in need.

Volunteer at the Construction Site - Construction experience is not required! Crew chiefs organize and lead all volunteers. Join us Wednesdays and Saturdays from 8:30 am–2:00 pm. Lunch is provided for volunteers. Check our website for our current worksite location and required liability releases. Please note: Youth ages 14-15 yrs are limited to non-construction type work on days of no active construction. Youth ages 16-17 yrs may participate at the worksite excluding power tools and roof work.

Public Relations - Assist with mailing the newsletter, special events, and small projects.

Church Relations - Have a HFHHC representative visit your Sunday School Class, Youth Group, or congregation.

Donate - HFHHC accepts financial donations in order to make a difference in more families' lives. Donations are received online through a secure site or can be mailed to HFHHC.

Carpenters Club - Members of the Carpenters Club commit to donate \$100 as each new house is built. You may choose to contribute to one, two, three or all four houses started each year.
