

Construction Dress Code and Proper Safety Equipment

Proper clothing is as essential to safety as the proper selection and use of tools.

Know and follow the Habitat dress code!

Footwear

- Closed toe shoes only.
- Work boots are preferred but thick-soled tennis shoes are allowed.

Shirts

- Shirts are <u>required at all</u> times.
- <u>NO</u> tank tops, tube tops, spaghetti string tops, or halter-tops are allowed.
- All <u>undergarments must be</u> covered.

Jewelry

 Must <u>not be</u> dangly or bulky.

Pants/Shorts

- Long pants are preferred.
- However, shorts are permitted, but <u>cannot be</u> shorter than mid-thigh.
- No overly baggy pants should be worn.

Loose clothing is dangerous around power tools.

Ear Plugs

- Are provided by Habitat.
- Are available for all construction site volunteers/workers
 <u>using a power tool</u> or when
 <u>instructed by a Habitat construction site crew chief or safety officer.</u>

Dust Masks

- Are provided by Habitat.
- Are available for all construction site volunteers/workers installing insulation, sanding, or when instructed by a Habitat construction site crew chief or safety officer.

Protective Glasses

- Are provided by Habitat, and are available for all construction site volunteers/workers.
- A worker <u>MUST</u> wear protective glasses any time he or she is <u>operating a power tool</u> or when <u>instructed by a Habitat con-</u> <u>struction site crew chief or safety officer.</u>

that may impede
