Our Tithe Partner - Lesotho, Africa



Twelve year old Limakatso lives with her 78 year old grandmother 'Mamatela at Tšoeneng Ha-Ramokitimi village. Her elder sister Nthabiseng, aged 22 is employed as a domestic worker in Maseru since September 2018. The Phatšoane family survives off

'Mamatela's pension fund, but live in constant worry and fear of a house that could potentially collapse over them as they sleep. Their former family house is ridden with deeply cracked walls where the outside could be seen through the cracks and an ill-fitting front door which barely closed shut, secured only by wire hinges. Cousin Teboho Phatšoane who lives just next door to the home worried endlessly for his relatives of either break-in attacks at night from the unsecured door, or the home collapsing on them during periods of bad weather.

The family moved into their Habitat home a few days before Christmas, 2018. Limakatso shared with excitement that it felt great to spend Christmas in a new home which had a window and a door that could open and close shut properly. The new home has given her a new found confidence at school and she is determined to work even harder and achieve greater success through her education. Limakatso is a bright young student and we are pleased to share she came in at the top of her class at the end of the academic year and successfully proceeded to grade 5 at Tšoeneng primary.
